## Our initiatives include

- Implementation of whole school approach to and explicit teaching of Literacy through the Reading to Learn Program (R2L).
- Focussed support of students in Literacy and Numeracy through targeted Teacher Aide support including Guide Reading Groups.
- Continued focus on Proportional Reasoning to improve Numeracy.
- Bulimba Thinking Classroom Project to make student thinking visible.
- Collegial Coaching to support reflective practice and improve pedagogy.
- Collaborative planning for curriculum implementation to ensure a narrow focus and explicit curriculum.
- Implementation of Digital Classrooms through mentoring and coaching.

- ✓ Student writing outcomes will improve through an explicit school wide approach.
- ✓ Student reading outcomes will continue to improve through an explicit school wide approach.
